A Solid Home: National Women's Conference 2020

Worship, Learning, Laughter. These were the highlights of the National CHOG Women's Conference held Feburary 13-16 in Korhogo. This year's theme was "How to Have a Solid Home." The women enjoyed conference sessions, group meals, and a hike at a local mountain. These led up to the *défilé* (*pictured right*) on Sunday morning. *What's a défilé?* Four years ago, I (Jenny) was asking myself that same question as I attended my first women's conference. At 7:30 a.m. on Sunday, before breakfast, all the women began to leave the conference



center on foot. I asked what was going on, and they said it was a *défilé*. I didn't know that French word at the time, so I just followed the other women.



We walked and walked and walked. And then, we walked some more until we reached the center of the village. We gathered in a group and marched from the center of town to where the Sunday morning worship would take place. We sang worship songs as we marched. I came away with knowledge of what a *défilé* was, and I also came away with a very sweaty dress and a sunburn! By the next conference, the women had a banner printed that said "National Women's Conference of the Church of God in Côte d'Ivoire," which two women carried as they led the procession.

This year, when they said *défilé*, I was right there, marching along as the women sang and danced to the place of worship. I believe that African women are among the strongest people I've ever met. Walking through the dust in the heat with babies on their backs, they don't complain at all. This march of worship was a great illustration of what it means to walk with the Lord, building a solid home with Christ as the foundation: It can be dry, and sometimes rough, but we are marching together, praising and singing the whole way.




CBH French Radio: Impacting Côte d'Ivoire
