When we first moved to Cote d'Ivoire, we discovered that lizards were a part of everyday life. Sometimes they were large ones with orange heads, crawling over the outside wall, while other smaller lizards would run in and out of the house through the open doors. We normally did not mind as they kept the mosquito population down, which helped tremendously at keeping us from catching malaria. We would also enjoy watching the lizards run and skid or jump off the veranda to get away from our two German shepherds. The lizards' funny and erratic jumping and head bobbing were fre-

quent source of amusement. Their "jumping for joy" antics seemed to contradict their menacing facial expression.

While some people see the Christian life as one of sad faces and stoic demeanor, we have seen quite the contrary in the exuberant way African believers express their joy for Jesus even when their lives are hard and trouble-filled. Like the crippled beggar healed by Peter and John by the temple (Acts 3), they are quick to jump up and "enter the temple... walking and jumping and giving praise to God." This letter highlights several events that we have been a part of in the last few months that give us great cause to "jump for joy".

What a JOY for us to return in mid-September to Rwanda to see those we had worked with on our last trip! The pastors and leaders were ready to jump right back into studying and learning once again. We held two teachings in different parts of the country, one with Rwandan leaders and another with those from neighboring Congo. They sang, prayed and discussed God's Word with great energy and joy.

On Sunday, we joined a mountain village church in Rwanda, meeting in a house. Though packed into a small space, more than a hundred persons sang, danced and jumped with joy as they worshiped the Lord, with others peering in the windows and doors. Rwandans are known for their high exuberant jumping as they dance, which was quite obvious as women and young children worshiped the Lord in bounds of joy and energetic rhythms.

We moved closer to the border with DRC; so that the Congolese pastors could easily meet us just inside Rwanda for classes. Some of these pastors we have known since we lived in this area thirty years ago. We enjoyed time one on one and also meeting as a group. We were thrilled to sing



and worship in Swahili and in French as they leapt with joy as only Congolese can.

We are already planning another trip there in March to continue teaching leaders from both countries and perhaps exploring a third country for future work.
