
IBAO Update

The new year also signaled the first IBAO module of 2022 and the final one for the current group of students before beginning their internships. These students, though our smallest IBAO class ever, have been our most faithful and motivated to complete their studies. In March, they will come to IBAO one last time for practical training and internship orientation. Then in April they will begin to serve as interns under experienced pastors in various local church settings, from a new church

plant in a heavily populated suburb of Abidjan, to working with an experienced church planter to plant new churches in rural villages in the west of the country, to serving established churches in the northern or central regions. In several cases, they will serve in different ethnic groups from their own, meaning they may need to adjust to a new language, culture and traditions in order to reach the local people in their own contexts. God is certainly initiating something new in the lives of these young men who are following his calling on their lives to serve him in new ways in 2022!

New Directions in 2022

While we have sensed that God had something new in store for us in the future, he initiated it much sooner than we anticipated, but it became apparent that it was right in line with his good timing. Since our landlord told us last July that he would be retaking the house that has been our home for the past 20 years, we knew that we would need to be out of the house in early 2022. So since November, we have been sorting, cleaning out and ridding ourselves of years of files, clothes, books, and other belongings that we no longer need. We stored our full house of furniture and personal belongings into our former office that we will rent from our landlord for



the next year. When our landlord arrived in early February, we were almost entirely moved out of the house. Since them we have been living in a nearby hotel until we finish our responsibilities with IBAO and the national leadership in March. We will travel to the USA in early April for our home assignment. Upon our return to CI next year, we will begin a new assignment based out of Abidjan, where we began our West Africa ministry 26 years ago. Future newsletters will share more of the details as God initiates something new for us and our future. Thank you for your continued partnership with us in the ministry in West Africa! We look forward to connecting with many of you during 2022.
